## METHODOLOGY



This poll was conducted between February 18 February 19, 2022 among a sample of 2210 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

## KEY FINDINGS

1. More than half of the adults polled report knowing someone who identifies as gay or lesbian while far fewer adults report knowing someone who identifies as transgender and/or non-binary. Younger adults, specifically GenZers, are dramatically more likely than their older counterparts to report knowing someone who identifies as transgender and/or nonbinary. Comparably, adults across the spectrum of age all report similar levels of knowing someone who personally identifies as gay, lesbian, bisexual, queer, or pansexual.
2. Most adults feel they are relatively knowledgeable about suicide prevention. Younger adults, specifically GenZers, parents, Black adults, and Hispanic adults are all significantly more likely than the mean to indicate they are knowledgeable about suicide prevention. Conversely, Baby Boomers, non-parents, suburban, and rural adults are all less knowledgeable than the average.
3. Adults are more comfortable if their child comes out as gay, lesbian, or bisexual than if they come out as transgender and/or non-binary. Comfortability for a child coming out as transgender and/ or non-binary is driven by Democrats and younger adults, specifically GenZers-the same can be stated for children who come out as gay, lesbian, or bisexual.
4. Seventy-two percent of adults are confident they would be able to understand and support their child if their child came out as transgender and/or non-binary. Additionally, more than half of adults across generation and political party are confident they would be able to understand and support their transgender and/or non-binary child.
5. Awareness of gender-neutral pronouns, like they/them, drives adults' confidence in their ability to understand and support their child if they came out as transgender and/or non-binary. Adults who were unaware of gender-neutral pronouns were 2.4 x more likely to lack confidence in their ability to understand and support their transgender and/or non-binary child.

Two-thirds of adults report personally knowing someone who identifies as gay or lesbian. Additionally, a fifth of adults report a lack of understanding of the term pansexual.

KNOWING SOMEONE WHO IS LGBTQ
Younger adults, specifically GenZers, are dramatically more likely to report personally knowing someone who identifies as non-binary, transgender, pansexual, queer, or bisexual. Generationally, younger and older adults report nearly equivalent levels of personally knowing a gay or lesbian person.

GENDER NEUTRAL PRONOUNS

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SOGI COMFORTABILITY
Comfortability for a child coming out as transgender is driven by Democrats and younger adults, specifically GenZers. Democrats are 2.4x more likely than Republicans to be very comfortable- more narrowly, discomfort is driven by Republicans. Additionally, GenZers are 2 x more likely than Baby Boomers to be very comfortable with a child coming out to them as transgender.

SOGI COMFORTABILITY
Similar comfortability trends emerge among a child coming out as nonbinary. Comfortability continues to be driven by Democrats and younger adults while discomfort is driven by Republicans.
How comfortable, if at all, would you be if your child came out to you as nonbinary, otherwise defined as someone who does not identify as either male or female and might identify somewhere in between or something completely different.


SOGI COMFORTABILITY
A majority of adults across generations are comfortable if their child came out to them as gay, lesbian, or bisexual. High comfortability, nevertheless, continues to be driven by Democrats and younger adults.

Of Baby Boomers express comfortability if their child came out to them as gay, lesbian, or bisexual. Adults across key demographics are dramatically more comfortable if their child came out to them as gay, lesbian, or
bisexual than if they came out to them as transgender and/or non-binary. The dichotomous comfortability is widest among older adults and Republicans.

Generation Z is uniquely and dramatically more very aware of gender-neutral pronouns to express gender identity than any other demographic group. Republicans, rural adults, and older adults are all significantly less very aware of gender-neutral pronouns than on average.

Half of adults (49\%) would be comfortable if their child started using they/them pronouns rather than he/him or she/her while a third report they would not be comfortable.

GENDER-NEUTRAL PRONOUNS
Awareness of gender-neutral pronouns drives comfortability around a child using they/them pronouns while unawareness drives discomfort across demographics. Nearly all of Generation Z was aware of they/them pronouns.
